#### The Ubiquity of Plastic in our Lives

Have you ever stopped to look around your home to note how much of the environment there is composed of plastic? It's everywhere!

We, at WUU, try to be good stewards of the environment by recycling our plastics when possible. The bins at Fahs are often full almost every week. Number 5's are picked up and transported by faithful WUU volunteers to Richmond, where they will be used in the manufacturing of items such as toothbrushes. The rest of the #1-7 plastic is taken by other WUU volunteers to a JCC Convenience (Recycling) Center once each week.

Please consider joining the present group of volunteers to be responsible for transporting the non #5 plastic to a JCC Center (one day of one week) this summer.
