How Important is Space to a Congregation? A UU Story

Sue Parilla, Jefferson Unitarian Church's (JUC; Golden, CO) volunteer coordinator, helps people find places to connect within the church. "I ask them, 'What's missing in your life? What would you like to do here? You came here for a reason. What is it?' "

... The right physical layout can be an asset in stimulating growth and vitality. At JUC, the church's front door opens into a wide entrance hall. At the end of the short hall is the welcome table where visitors get a friendly welcome and a temporary name tag.

Turn left from the welcome table and the sanctuary is right there. Walk straight ahead and you find yourself in a large open foyer and commons area. . .It enables [the volunteer and membership coordinators]. . .to easily move around and talk with people. There is no claustrophobic "cattle chute" at JUC.

"It's hard to overestimate the value of our foyer in growing the church," says [membership coordinator] Annie Hedberg. The space immediately outside the sanctuary doors is reserved for new people. All others are encouraged to move deeper into the commons for their conversations.
