Located at 5249 Olde Towne Road, the OTMC provides medical and dental services to over 4,700 uninsured and underinsured patients in the Greater Williamsburg area annually. "The majority of our patients are employed, but their employers either offer no health insurance or offer insurance that is not affordable. Since our uninsured patients pay for their services on a sliding scale, based on family income, OTMC can never be self-sufficient. Although OTMC receives financial support from local governments and grants, we rely on special events and the support of local organizations and individuals to expand our effort to provide quality health care.

Understanding the Doctrine of Discovery Study Group

The Doctrine of Discovery (DOD, also called the Doctrine of Christian Discovery) is a principle law developed in a series of 15th century Papal bulls and 16th century charters by Christian European monarchs on the basis ow which much of the rest of the world was explored and colonized by Europeans. It contained a theological justification of colonization that later became a nationalistic one.

Learn about the historical impact of the Doctrine of Discovery (DOD) on the world and how we as Unitarian-Universalists can help repudiate the DOD. Discover connections of the DOD to immigration issues. Understand the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples as an antidote to the effects of the DOD.
