"The Self-Fulfilling Prophecies of Scarcity and Abundance"

Rev. Andrew Millard When it comes to money and other limited resources, it's natural to act out of a sense of scarcity, whereas it takes intention and effort to adopt an attitude of abundance. Such behaviors, however, are not so much reflective of the availability of resources as they are predictive of them. So when it comes to funding our Unitarian Universalist mission and ministry, to live the promise of our liberal religion, how do we move from scarcity to abundance?

The WUU Annual Fund pays for WUU operations - salaries for our dedicated minister and staff, other costs of WUU operations, our mortgage payments, our social justice work, and other work of the congregation.

Through your generosity last year, we raised over \$322,000 for the current year. This year's annual fund goal, based on the three year budget adopted by the WUU Board, is \$331,000. The funds pledged and paid will allow us to cover approximately 80% of WUU operating costs for the July 2014-June 2015 year.


