Education (LFD) Small Group Meeting Notes February 25, 2014

Overview of Programs

- Nursery every Sunday
- 2 Sunday mornings classes for pre-K thru 2nd grade (Fahs)
- Small tables & chairs/art supplies
- 3/4/5 graders meet at Fahs LR
- Art happens in part of kitchen
- 6/7/8 graders meet at Parker either upstairs or basement
- 2 flat screen tv's one upstairs and one downstairs
- 7/8/9 graders in OWL (12 session program)
- Other 2 Sundays 1 with all ages/ 1 children's chapel in Fahs (20 to 22 could be as large as 35)
- High school kids meet at 4 PM in Parker games, sports, instructional, discussion, religion subject matter (eastern, all)

Problems/Issues/Concerns with Current Amenities

- No space for adult education on Sunday
- Religious education now is same as it was 25 years ago flat growth is this due to size limitations?
- Do demographics affect how many families with young children join WUU?
- Recent growth of RE programs (younger children) over last 4 years
- Does quality of space reflect less value being placed on RE for children (Fahs, playground, etc.)?
- Capacity of sanctuary and classrooms is a negative
- Separate classrooms from church is a problem
 - New members & guests have difficulty connecting when they need to "check" the kids out of Fahs house
 - o Older kids want to head back to sanctuary space on their own safety issue
- Security issues for checking kids in and out check in process by teacher difficult with merged classes
- Noise from small kids' area into big kids' area
- Tight spaces too crowded
- Children's chapel
 - o Currently, CHAOS! Not enough space for this, currently.
 - o Music important little space for performance

• Participation now by singing – would like to have them up, moving, singing, playing

LFD Needs/Wants

- Guest speakers need to accommodate presentations high schoolers as well as other classrooms
- All rooms need IT A/V smartboards want students to be interactive
- Need enough classrooms so all can meet at same time
- Dedicated teen space needed
- Multi-generational events and projects
- Comfortable seating allows kids to open up and interact
- Beanbags & comfortable couches
- Craft spaces important easy to clean up
- Lighting? Natural, non-harsh
- More space for social activities together spaces to gather with each other during the week – other than Sunday morning
- Community outreach space for social activities
- Amphitheater space?
- Navigators need space once per month now meet at Fahs
- Outside Services need some level of protection for families with kids and buffer from Ironbound Road noise
- Space sizes:
 - Pre-K thru 2nd grade: 22 to 30
 - o 3/4/5 grades: 18
 - Popcorn theology 6/7/8: 12 (8 of these are in OWL)
 - o High school: 20
 - College students young adults (18 thru 35): no programs now
 - Approximately 12 rooms for all (children and adults)
 - 5 kids 2/1/1/nursery
 - o 1 Adults
 - o 1 Covenant group room
 - o 1 WALT
 - o 1 Eastern Philosophy room
 - o 1 Navigators/other (high school, young adult?)
 - o 1 extra

Nursery & Young Children's Spaces

- Infants through 3 years
- Need space to "ween" them into the older kid areas
- Children sized toilets for nursery and younger kids
- Family restrooms with changing stations
- This experience should not feel like school special space for kids just like sanctuary is sacred space for adults
- Special entrance special gate special door

- Spaces need to be together
- Tension of shared spaces vs. dedicated spaces

Playground & Other Outdoor Spaces

- Covered seating/picnic area
- Outside space important like to be outside playing!
- Need more swings
- A playground that can be used during the week use as a draw to families to WUU
- Playground is crowded with little kids where can the older kids go?
- Maybe separation of playground into age groups
- Accessible for those with disabilities
- Playground adjacent to nursery
- Maintain/provide a natural feeling in outdoor spaces
- Save the trees sacred spaces
- Outdoor gardens how can they be retained in the new plan? Perhaps a community garden for WUU members?

Storage Needs

- Paper, paint, costumes, story kits, all craft items
- Outside toys
- Outdoor equipment storage

Adult programs

- Eastern philosophy space meditation and other eastern religion yoga special finishes, special treatments
- Monday meditation (Buddhist) has 30 attendees
- Acoustics, lighting important daytime and evening
- WALT dedicated space some classes are simultaneous
 - o WALT groups have around 12 participants
 - o WALT administrator space
- Covenant groups currently meet in homes (may continue this) how do we create comfortable spaces at WUU that could have the same feel as the home environment?
- Other adult spaces needed during the week
 - o i.e., One Year to Live group
 - $\circ \quad \text{UU orientation} \\$
 - o Odyssey
 - o Compassion Deep Study
 - o Arts group
 - Parents as Spiritual Teachers
 - Use spaces for more than one purpose
 - Typical group size 10 to 12
 - o Access to kitchen for meals and refreshments

Other Thoughts/Ideas

- Bringing outside groups here gets the word out about WUU
- How do you have a space that allows projects to be carried on after one Sunday? Multipurpose spaces don't allow this to happen
- Consider dedicated craft space/studio space? These spaces can be inspirational and instill respect for others
