There were no speakers from the community. About 25 WUU's were on hand to lend support. This approval was necessary to allow our expansion and it keeps us on schedule toward construction in September. The application goes before the the JCC Board of Supervisors in January, with the hope of final approval.

Equal Exchange Coffee and Chocolate-Coffee Cabinet Now in the Library

Did you know that WUU sells coffee, tea, and chocolate? The proceeds not only benefit WUU, your purchase of fairly traded coffee and chocolate helps build pride, independence and community empowerment for small farmers and their families. A coffee processing plant in El Salvador, community stores in Colombia, the training of doctors in Mexico, new schools in Peru - these are examples of initiatives co-ops have taken in their own communities with the income from Fair Trade.

Coffee and chocolate will be available for sale on most Sundays in the library--look for the big cabinet. Coffee (ground, whole bean, and k-cups) are all priced at \$10/bag or box; Tea is \$5/box; Chocolate is \$3/large bars, 2/\$3 for medium bars, and minis are 5/\$1 and taxes are included and you are supporting two great causes! Let's Celebrate our Successes

In this season of celebration, let's celebrate our successful year as a congregation. It began with a flawless operation of the Community of Faith mission, continued with a 25th Anniversary celebration that brought together many old friends who were involved in the

In this season of celebration, let's celebrate our successful year as a congregation. It began with a flawless operation of the Community of Faith mission, continued with a 25th Anniversary celebration that brought together many old friends who were involved in the founding and the nurturing of this congregation, and led to a September decision to take the first steps toward the expansion of the sanctuary building to meet the congregation community's needs. The November gala affirmed the congregation's vote to develop plans and pursue financing by the announced pacesetter pledges of over \$1.1 million. Along the way, the congregation bore witness to the removal of legal barriers to marriage (something we had advocated just 7 years earlier), celebrated the arts and the environment, participated in a youth mission trip to West Virginia, hired a new director of religious education, listened to and participated in stirring sermons and music programs, and took many important steps in caring for each other.

In each of the calendar year 2014 highlights above – and the many more that go unmentioned – we chose to support this congregation with our time, talent and treasure. That treasure included the annual canvass, which (with recent gifts from new members), now stands at \$325,496 in 2014-15 pledges from 186 households. The gifts pledged for this year are now slightly above the amounts raised in 2013-14, and the amounts paid so far are coming in ahead of schedule. Annual pledge payments allow us to carry out our mission, through the labors of Rev. Jennifer and her team of dedicated staff and volunteers, and support the activities of congregational committees and program teams responsible for much of our success.

Thank you for your many contributions to the success of our congregation, and best wishes for a memorable and happy holiday season. The Stewardship Committee looks forward to working with you to build upon our successes this year and to develop an annual canvass that will support the dreams of our future facilities.
