Today! Dr. King Memorial Service

The History Ministry of **First Baptist Church** will present a public program on **Thursday**, **January 15**, **at 6:00 p.m**., in remembrance of and to honor the birth date of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

The one-hour program, "Rally For Justice: Looking Back, Moving Forward", will highlight the Voting Rights Act of 1965, the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the current issues such as voter suppression, inequality in education and economics, gun violence and the criminal justice system, and the importance of the NAACP, in the face of such difficult times. The event will conclude with a symbolic Rally/March from the First Baptist Church sanctuary to the MLK Memorial Marker at the triangle on Scotland and Prince George Streets. A reception in the FBC Fellowship Hall will immediately follow the program. I encourage you to support First Baptist as they honor the life and work of Dr. King, and the role of the NAACP in the rally for justice.

Currently, the Green Sanctuary Program at the denominational level is focusing on issues of climate change and environmental justice. This is an opportune time for WUU to rejuvenate and refocus our Green Sanctuary program, and to raise congregational awareness of current environmental issues.
