### Greetings Friends,

I am the Rev. Sherman Logan, a candidate for Unitarian Universalist Ministry, and I am excited to spend the next few weeks serving as your summer minister. It is an honor and privilege and I feel extremely blessed that Rev. Jennifer and your Board have extended to me this awesome opportunity to minister to you, the wonderful members here at Williamsburg Unitarian Universalists. I look forward to working alongside Rev. Jennifer and all of you.

I was born in Richmond VA, the older of two children. My sister, who is also a minister and my mother live in Henrico County. I currently live in Sandston with the love of my life, my wife Franka. We are parents to five beautiful children, Wendy 41, Charmaine 39, Liza 38, Jennifer 31, and Sherman III 28 (and a Jack Russell Terrier, Max). We are also grandparents to a beautiful precocious two year old, Kayla and expecting our second grandchild in December.

I received my elementary and secondary education in the Richmond public schools. Upon graduation from high school I went on to attend the University of Virginia in Charlottesville where I earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology.

After graduating from UVA, I began a twenty-year career in Retail Management. In 2001, I left the retail business and went to work for Trinity Baptist Church in Richmond as the Director of Economic Development. My primary responsibilities were managing the church's financial operations, directing Capital stewardship campaigns, overseeing church expansion projects, church membership growth, and development programs.

While at Trinity, I answered the call to ministry and enrolled in the Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology at Virginia Union University. There, I earned the Master of Divinity degree in 2005. I was granted my license to preach in 2004 and was ordained as a Baptist Minister in 2006. In addition to my duties as the Director of Economic Development, I was also appointed as an associate minister of the church.

In September 2008, I was hired by The First Unitarian Universalist Church of Richmond as the Church Business Manager. In addition to my duties as Business Manager, I also lead the Christian Theist small group; conduct Wednesday Vespers services and our monthly Friday night services. I have also had the privilege to lead Sunday services and preach on numerous occasions. I have also preached here at



Williamsburg Unitarian Universalists as a guest minister, as well as in other UU congregations.

While serving as Business manager at First UU, I became immersed in the UU culture, attending every GA since 2009, participating in numerous workshops, taking classes at Meadville Lombard Theological School and Star King School for the ministry. I became a UU in 2010 and started my Journey toward becoming a UU minster. I was granted candidate status in 2011, and I am scheduled to meet with the Ministerial Fellowship Committee this December.

One of the requirements as a Candidate for UU ministers is to serve as an intern in a parish setting. However since I am an ordained minister, I was granted a waiver from the internship requirement. Personally, I felt that it would behoove me to gain more practical experience by serving in another UU setting. This experience would enhance my knowledge and help better prepare me for UU ministry.

In the coming days and weeks I look forward to meeting you all and learning the wonders of your life and faith stories. I also look forward with great anticipation to forming new relationships, and working alongside with each of you as we continue to do the transformative ministries of this congregation. I am eternally grateful to Rev Jennifer and the fine folks here at Williamsburg UU for graciously allowing me this opportunity.

### Share the Plate for July 6, 2014 Community Resources Center

The Share the Plate collection for Sunday, July 6, will be donated to the Community Resources Center, sponsored by the United Way. The CRC provides information and referral services to an average of 1500 clients per month. The agency offers assistance, either directly or through community partnerships, with housing and rental assistance, shelter, utility payment assistance, minor car repairs, food, clothing, household needs and a host of other services. Partnerships with the faith community provide important support in meeting the needs of hundreds of families each month. The Community Resource Center also offers a mobile food pantry, to augment FISH services, assisting 100 families with meat and fresh produce. In addition, CRC operates three re-entry homes, housing 10 males re-entering back into the community, and. also, four houses where homeless families are assisted in transitioning from homelessness to complete self-sufficiency.

#### News from the Board

"Sumer is icumen in, Lhude sing cuccu!" (Summer has come in, Loudly sing, Cuckoo!) Summer – a time to relax, to enjoy the warmth of the sun, to put an end to some activities and pursuits, while beginning and planning for new ones. Yes, summer has come in; sing loudly!

Your Board is singing loudly this summer.

We are cheering and hope you will join us in celebrating the success of us all: Late news---With all of our pledge commitments for the coming year, we have exceeded the budgeted income from pledges! Let's give each other a pat on the back and a big thanks. Together, as a congregation, we can do great things, moving forward on our mission to serve!

Last month we presented to the congregation a statement of strong support of the Building Our Future Task Force and its work.

- During our recent meeting, the Board once again reviewed, with Roger Guernsey, chair of the Design/ Build Team, two things: the preliminary facility expansion plan and the continuing process as the congregation explores expansion. The Board is in full agreement that the Design/Build Team and the architects have focused on the most needed improvements to our facilities in the preliminary plan, improvements that will provide needed space for us to better carry out our mission and realize Vision 2017.
- The Board thanks and congratulates the Building Our Future Task Force and Design/Build Team for their continued intense work and it wholeheartedly supports the entire process as it takes WUU through the next stages to our congregational meeting on September 21st when the congregation will determine if we move to building.
- We urge everyone to continue reviewing the preliminary plans, talk with members of the DBT, submit questions and comments to them. Input from everyone is needed and welcomed.
- At our August meeting, the Board will review the plan again, along with all the questions and comments the congregation has put forward, and the results of the Financial Feasibility Study. We will then submit to the congregation a proposal that will

be considered and voted upon at the September 21st congregational meeting.

By the time you read this, we will have met with Fred Gilbertson, the chair of the Nominating Committee, to learn how that committee operates and discuss ways to enhance the nominating process. Suggestions from those of



you who have been nominated for office or participated on the committee are welcome.

We also will have considered our Vision 2017, determining if it is time for an update of it. You may be hearing more of this soon.

Next month, with the Stewardship Committee joining us, WUU's Stewardship program will be studied to ensure the current Board and Stewardship Committee are in tune with the program set in place three years ago and that steps are in place to achieve the ultimate goals.

As August arrives, the Financial Feasibility Study will have been completed, Austen Petersen will have been with WUU for a month, our "summer minister" Sherman Logan will be halfway through his time with us. It is also time for the Board to make a major decision: to build or not to build, that will be our question. What shall we propose the congregation? Please keep your thoughts, questions and concerns going to the Building Our Future Task Force and its Design/Build Team. What you have to say will be a major portion of what is studied by us as we make that determination.

For the Board, summer is not a time of relaxation, but it is a time for pursuit of beginnings and enhancements. We'll be singing loudly, hopefully melodically. Please visit us at a meeting:  $4^{\rm th}$  Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm in Fahs.

With this new technology, many problems can be fixed without having to make a trip to the campus and, more importantly, we anticipate energy savings by being able to better manage the heating and cooling settings for the occasion rather than trying to anticipate what the heating and cooling requirements are.
